Adrian Wyard and his stunning visuals previously featured with Holst's *The Planets* in spring of 2018. Wyard lends his artistry to Mussorgsky's epic *Pictures at an Exhibition*, a piece inspired by different works of art. "The Gnome", "Ballet of the Unhatched Chicks", "The Market" and more are brought to life with Wyard's visuals. Also featured is the overture to *Ruslan and Lyudmila* by Mikhail Glinka and Adam Schoenberg's Grammy-nominated *Pictures Studies*: a *Pictures at an Exhibition* for the 21st century. Before the concert, catch a free pre-concert talk about the program with Music Director Wesley Schulz and KING FM Host Dave Beck at 1:30 p.m.

In partnership between Auburn Symphony Orchestra and Interurban Center for the Arts, nearly 300 Auburn School District students will create art inspired by Mussorgsky's enduring work. The artwork will be on display in the lobby at the concert for all to enjoy.
